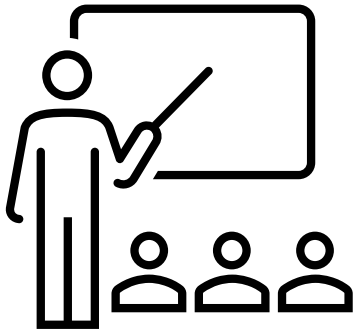


What is it?

“A college degree needs to be within reach for every Wisconsin citizen as a path to a better life and the Wisconsin Tuition Promise will provide these opportunities. It is also how we can close the skills gap that now limits Wisconsin’s potential to thrive in a global economy.”

— UW System President Jay Rothman

- Co-branded UW System and campus financial aid program for UW System schools (excluding Madison).
- Guarantee that tuition and fees will be paid by grant funds for qualifying students (up to 18 credits).



What are the eligibility requirements?

- Submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- Be a Wisconsin resident.
- First-time bachelor or associate degree seeking (includes first-time transfer) effective fall 2023.
- In the first year have \$62,000 or lower adjusted gross income.
- Must have been employed at some point during the preceding year.



What are the requirements for continued eligibility?

- Must maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) and continue to meet all Title IV eligibility requirements and any additional state requirements.
- Eligibility is limited to eight semesters for first-time bachelor-degree-seeking students and four semesters for associate-degree-seeking and first-time transfer students. The semester count will start with the fall 2023 term or beginning enrollment term thereafter.
- Applicant must be continuously enrolled (winter and summer terms excluded) in the same academic career (i.e., associate or bachelor's degree).

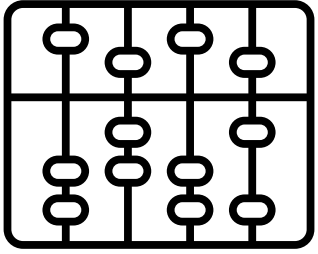

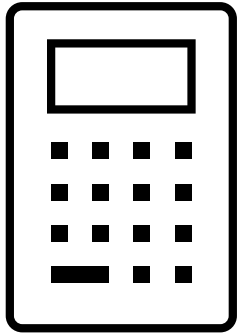


What limits apply?

- Fall and spring enrollment only; attend full-time (12+ credit hours) each semester.
- Eight semesters of eligibility total for bachelor-degree-seeking students. Four semesters of eligibility for associate-degree-seeking and transfer students. A student who transfers after the first year could be eligible for six semesters. Count begins fall 2023.
- Must be continuously enrolled (winter and summer terms excluded) in the same academic career (i.e. associate or bachelor).
- Must maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) and continue to meet all Title IV eligibility requirements and any additional state requirements.
- Special pricing and online programs not included.
- Time limit – maximum 8 semesters.

Bachelor's degree – 8 semesters

Transfer student bachelor's degree – 6 semesters

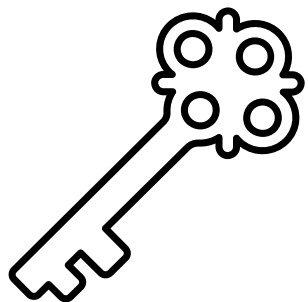


How is it calculated?

- “Last dollar” program
- First dollar:
 - Pell grant
 - FSEOG
 - Wisconsin Grant

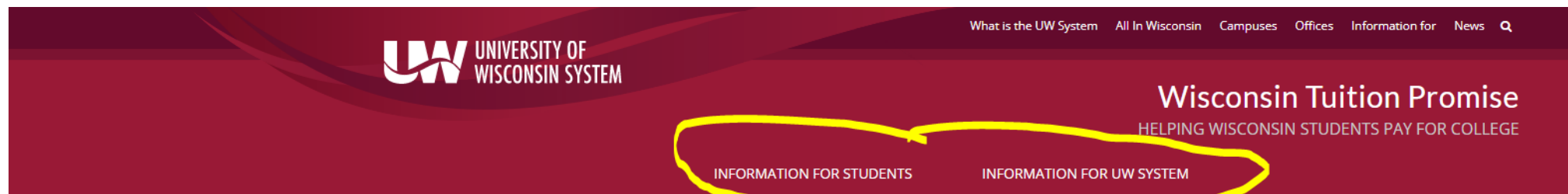
FORMULA

$$\begin{aligned} & \text{WI Resident Tuition} \\ & + \text{Differential Tuition} \\ & + \text{Standard Segregated Fees} \\ & \quad \text{(excluding Text Rental)} \\ & = \text{Eligible Tuition and Fees} \\ & \quad - \text{Federal Pell Grant} \\ & \quad - \text{Federal SEOG} \\ & \quad - \text{Wisconsin Grant} \\ & = \text{Wisconsin Tuition Promise} \end{aligned}$$
